Join us for a **light lunch**, followed by a discussion of these and other fascinating questions at a special Lenten Reflections program in the Chapel **after today's worship service**. Led by **Pastor Erica Rader**, we'll consider how the "real" Rabbi Jesus taught and lived, and how the people of his time would have viewed him.

Handel's Messiah – The Spring Sing!! From Messiah Sing Conductor David Herberg: My favorite movement is number 48, The Trumpet Shall Sound. Not only is this a fine example of Baroque trumpet, its masterful word painting really tells the story of the final resurrection. This was the first Messiah movement I learned, soon after beginning to learn to play trumpet. In fact, at the time, I was only barely aware that it was a portion of a larger work. In high school, I sequestered myself in the basement of the city library and transcribed the solo from listening to vinyl records over and over and over. I eventually played it in church.
